CHECK LIST

for submitting a doctoral dissertation to the Doctoral School of Chemistry (DSC) July 3, 2025

To do:

- 1. Proof of the fulfillment of the language requirements: the language exam certificates should be recorded in the Neptun system
- 2. Oral presentation of the dissertation in front of an expert audience with a follow-up discussion. The audience should vote on the approval of the submission.
- 3. Tips for the preparation of the dissertation before similarity screening: figures and tables of the candidate's publications can be used in the dissertation if appropriately referenced in the captions. At the end of the dissertation, after the References chapter, a chapter with the list of publications related to the dissertation along with the oral presentations and posters should be added.
- 4. Electronic submission of the dissertation in WORD and/or PDF format to the Head of the Doctoral School of Chemistry (e-mail to atoth@chem.u-szeged.hu) for similarity screening. Based on the feedback from the DSC, the dissertation may need rewriting. (The whole process takes ca. 14 days)
- 5. Once the DSC approved the dissertation, it can be uploaded along with the thesis booklet to the Doctoral repository of the University of Szeged

Submit:

- 1. The statement of approval from the DSC after the similarity screening
- 2. Doctoral dissertation in 4 copies, black bound
- 3. Theses booklet in English in 7 copies, with co-author statements in all copies, following L1 and L2 schemes according to the requirements of the Doctoral School of Chemistry
- 4. Publication list with MTMT identification number along with the full publications related to the dissertation should be submitted electronically to the doctoral administrator (e-mail to horpacsi.anita@sci.u-szeged.hu). Printed copies of the publications are not required.
- 5. Supervisor statement on that the publications relevant to the dissertations are used in at most one additional doctoral dissertation
- 6. Written support of the submission by an expert audience after the applicant's presentation of the dissertation and the follow-up discussion
